Adoracja Najświętszego Sakramentu Pojęcie adoracji

Przez *adorację* rozumiemy cześć oddawaną Panu Jezusowi obecnemu pod postacią Chleba eucharystycznego. Zwykłą formą adoracji jest przyklęknięcie na jedno kolano: przy podejściu do ołtarza z Najświętszym Sakramentem, przed Komunią świętą i przed odejściem od ołtarza; uklęknięcie na Podniesienie, przyklęknięcie przy przechodzeniu przed tabernakulum poza Mszą świętą oraz klęczenie podczas prywatnej modlitwy. Uroczystą formą adoracji jest wystawienie Chleba eucharystycznego w monstrancji i towarzyszące temu ceremonie. Szczególnymi zaś formami adoracji są: Nabożeństwo czterdziestogodzinne i tzw. adoracja wieczysta, czyli stałe wystawienie Chleba eucharystycznego w niektórych kościołach lub kaplicach oraz bezustanne adorowanie¹¹.

Adoracja jest oddawaniem najgłębszej czci Obecności Bożej i zarazem głębokim aktem dziękczynienia, jakie składamy Ojcu za to, że w swoim Synu nawiedził i odkupił swój lud. Jak przypomina nam Pismo święte, Jezus spędzał całe noce na modlitwie, zwłaszcza wtedy, gdy miał podjąć ważne decyzje. Chrześcijanie, naśladowując Chrystusa, przyjmują podczas adoracji postawę dziecięcej ufności oraz otwierają swoje serca i dłonie, aby przyjąć dar od Boga i podziękować Mu za Jego dobrodziejstwa¹².
